Learning from Steelhead Fly Fishing Tactics with John Sherman



While many people consider steelhead fly fishers a group of somewhat strange masochists (steelhead being the fish of a thousand casts, the weather often cold, etc.), we all should admit that tactics developed by steelheaders have helped everyone who is going to a trout stream. These tactics include the recent success of spey casting techniques (which are not just for two-handed rods but also for eight and nine foot, singlehanded rods), but nymphing strategies as well and how to search for and locate fish. No one knows this better than John Sherman who, in addition to traveling regularly in California, Nevada, Arizona and Hawaii representing Simms fly fishing gear and Hatch Outdoors sales (especially their fine reels), has fished *a lot* for steelhead in California, Oregon, Washington and British Columbia.

John has presented to our clubs before and, because of his highly professional photography skills and his wonderful storytelling abilities, has impressed everyone in SoCal. This month will be no exception, with John being the perfect guide for this topic -- we will see and learn about all the wonderful opportunities to fish up and down the left side of the country and how to increase our fishing skills for different species.

John was born and raised in Visalia, California where, at eight years of age and hanging around Buz's, the local fly shop, he learned how to fly fish. In 1999, John graduated from California State University Chico with a degree in Business Administration and Marketing. But fly fishing was his passion, so after graduation, he spent two months fishing for steelhead in British Columbia. (Didn't want to rush that getting down to work routine.)



While attending Chico State, John worked at the Powell Fly Shop and guided on the Feather and Sacramento Rivers for steelhead and salmon. Since then, John has fished the West Coast from Alaska to the Baja Peninsula for everything from steelhead, to salmon, stripers, black bass, trout and numerous blue water species. He has also hosted numerous trips around the globe, including taking fly fishers to such exotic locales as Australia, Russia, Iceland, Mexico, Canada, the Bahamas, Belize, Argentina and Indonesia. John is also a very accomplished outdoor photographer who has had his work published in magazines such as *Field & Stream, Fly Fisherman, Fly Rod & Reel, The Drake, California Fly Fisher, Northwest* and *Southwest Fly Fishing*. He has been documenting his expeditions with a camera since the age of 10.






NYMPHING CLINIC REMINDER


Bishop, CA. October 31, November 1,2 By Bill Woods, Outings Chair

Longtime friend and fellow angler Mas Okui delivered a touching account of Kazy's profound influence on the Club and his acts of generosity to new and old Club

members. Other Club members came forward with similar stories of how Kazy had touched their lives by his instruction, enthusiasm and expertise. A voracious collector of equipment, Kazy left behind a warehouse full of rods, reels and fly tying equipment. Although his first love was deep sea fishing, he was able to excel in any fishing situation. He often joked that, despite his angling passion and Japanese heritage, he never developed a taste for eating fish. Ranch manager, Kevin Peterson said, "We are delighted to honor the memory of Kazy in this way – this was a special place for him and we will miss his visits here." Also in attendance were Kazy's widow Joanne, daughter Julie and grandson Reed. The plaque will be a permanent reminder of a truly remarkable angler and the next best thing to having him guide you on the stream he loved so much.


CONSERVATION

Y es there is fishing in the Santa Monica Mountains. This summer saw the launching of an enhancement project to give the endangered southern steelhead below Rindge Dam and little bit more wiggle room from the predators - aka carp, small mouth bass and bluegill, found above the dam. Guys and gals from SPFF, Santa Barbara, Southern Sierra and South Bay have been pitching in on the "Catch and Remove" effort. The bluegill were easy picking, the bass slightly harder and the carp way too smart for me. A couple hundred pounds of fish are now crayfish trap bait, and then the crayfish are fed to the orphaned raccoons and other critters. Interesting cycle, isn't it? 
