


ANNUAL FUNDRAISER AND LIVE AUCTION

SPFF MEMBERS BENEFIT FROM JARDINE'S MASTER CLASS ON THE OWENS RIVER

Following a two-day master class on the Lower Owens River, Club members Ari Young and Leeanne Shin ventured out to try the tight-line European nymphing style taught by UK veteran angler, and January presenter, Charles Jardine. Following an amazing day on the river, Ari wrote the following letter of thanks to Charles:

First and foremost, thank you so much for your generosity and [the] time you gave us. It is something special that both Leeanne and I consider privileged to have the opportunity to learn from you. So thank you and Marshall, as well, for making this all happen!

Today we thought we would try a bit downstream, away from the fishing pressure in the first 3 miles. We fished a section that is 2 driving (probably at least 6 river miles) miles downstream from the old tree. We just had an incredibly successful day. Leeanne caught five fish and I caught 7 including a sucker (which we all know doesn't count for much

in terms of table fare). When I first hooked it and it began to bulldoze downstream I thought I had one of those fish that haunt ones' imagination and are only seen in movies.

Leeanne took me to the run [where] she caught a few with an ant Saturday, and I watched her Czech nymph it for... two 13" browns. I fished a run upstream of there and produced 5 similar sized browns and large sucker. There was a little more cloud cover today and the same 20-minute BWO hatch at 1PM. Prepared I was this time, and caught a 13" brown on the foolproof size 16 Parachute Adams. But, I must admit I fished down and across. crouched on the top of the bank, as there was no other way to present [a fy] into a deep dark alley, lined with tules. I can't wait to find a situation where I can use the upstream "S" mend you taught me on a fish across [the] current.

We had such a great time and attribute our success today to the nymphing




methods you taught us over the weekend. I can tell you it is addicting when you go 3 fish for 3 casts, and then two more casts and another hookup. Deadly, effective, in-the-zone, cheating, stupid, illegal, and wrong. It's just wrong when things come together so easily, yes? One begins to feel bad about such effective methods?

SUPER BOWL OUTING—EXCITING, JUST LIKE THE GAME!





With temperatures in Minnesota barely reaching a positive number, SPFF club members took advantage of clear blue skies and temperatures in the 70s for the Club's annual Super Bowl Outing to the Eastern Sierra. Flows on the Lower Owens (or Middle Owens as it is now called) dipped down to 96 cfs from previous month's highs over 400 cfs, making for easy access and wading. To everyone's surprise, the parking turnouts on Chalk Bluff Road were not crowded and the traditional spots above Benton Crossing were virtually deserted. Fishing reports showed wild swings from day to day—going





nymphing the faster, more aerated runs in the wild trout section, and even managed a couple of nice browns on a #18 BWO. As the sun set and the cold set in at 4:00 p.m., the bite died off. The usual nymph suspects (Zebra Midge and Pheasant Tail) worked, as did larger Frenchies and suggestive competition-style patterns. On Saturday, we had to try the Upper Owens. We fished for two hours—nada, nothing, zero, zilch.

I had great success on Friday afternoon tight-line

from "red hot" to "couldn't buy a fish."

Dinner at the Bishop Country Club was the usual forum for stories, lies, half-truths and exaggeration. Over 40 members attended and most, if not all, had brought a few fish to net. Norm Willis's grandson had a stellar weekend, catching a quite unreasonable number of fish for a novice! He may even have out-fished our resident ringer, Mr. Richard Plunkett!
